<p>5.0 Community Feedback</p>	<p>The talk in the community is more about whether the project will even going ahead more than anything else at this time.</p> <p>With depressed prices of iron ore people doubt very much that it will go ahead.</p> <p>From a council perspective they will continue to work and plan with Iron Road as the resource is not going away.</p> <p>Farming is going great at present.</p> <p>TAFE are undertaking a community consultation across EP this week to determine the need for and requirements of campuses across the region.</p>	
<p>6.0 Iron Road Project Update</p>	<p>For Iron Road it is business as usual.</p> <p>As a result of project stage completion and budget restraints, staff have been downsized.</p> <p>The next milestone will be the project government assessment outcome. Iron Road are currently in consultation with DSD and DPTI who are under taking a high level review of the compliance requirements of the draft Mining Lease Proposal (MLP) in reference to the determination and Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) in reference to the issued guidelines. Iron Road expects a response on their draft document from government by the 17th July. The formal community consultation and public exhibition of the documents is expected to commence mid-September. There will be a 6-12 week period for people to respond to the MLP and EIS application's and will include three public meetings across the region.</p> <p>Time line for approval outcome – possibly mid 2016 at the earliest</p>	

<p>6.1 CEIP Community Perceptions Survey</p>	<p>A Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) has been recently developed with Eyre Peninsula peak bodies including EPLGA, EPNRM, RDA WEP and EPICCA. The MOU is agreement that the regional bodies will work with IR to achieve best outcomes from the CEIP for the region.</p> <p>Helen: Declaration of Interest – was discussed at NRM meeting</p> <p>IR recently undertook a community perceptions survey on the CEIP. This was developed and facilitated by a local Adelaide research firm called Square Holes. The purpose of the survey was to assist with some data for the MLP and EIS, get a sense of how well understood the CEIP was in the community, to ensure that IR had not missed any key challenges or benefits the community saw as a priority and to inform their engagement going forward.</p> <p>Having never carried out a perceptions survey before, IR were not sure what sort of results to expect, it was an ideal time to get a sense of project perceptions around the benefits and challenges that they can use as a baseline measure for the future as IR move through the assessment process and into construction and operational phases.</p> <p>Results of the survey were distributed to committee members.</p> <p>The survey results will also be available on the IR website under Stakeholders – Information and links.</p>	
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<p>7.0 Council Report</p>	<p>The council met with IR today to discuss the road network around the mine site at Warrambo and accommodation village in Wudinna.</p> <p>The EPLGA supported the Memorandum of Understanding. The 1st draft of the Aksitics Report is complete and will be made available when finalised, outlining options for infrastructure development to support the project.</p> <p>Will Iron Road pay rates to the Wudinna District Council as an operating mine?</p> <p>It is expected that when the ML is granted – or preferably after Iron Road has approval to commence construction, Council will rezone the land which will result in higher rates than those currently paid by landowners. Alternatively, Iron Road may enter into an agreement with Council to cover the payment of rates, but the amount of those rates always come down to what the land is zoned as (e.g. agricultural, primary production, manufacturing, residential). The accommodation village in Wudinna will also be required to pay rates as per zoning requirements.</p>

<p>8.1 Refining the Outcomes with Iron road</p>	<p>Members spent time reviewing the response to the Outcomes presented by Iron Road. It was accepted that there was not enough time to discuss all, but to “test” some for acceptance by the members.</p>
