Iron Road Public Submission Response Documents

Iron Road has spent the past four months intensively working on the CEIP response documents for both the Mining Lease Proposal and the Environmental Impact Statement. These documents will be lodged with the Department of State Development and the Department of Planning, Transport and Infrastructure on or before the 30th June 2016. Both departments will undertake an adequacy check to review whether Iron Road has effectively responded to the various questions raised by both the public and Government agencies before formally accepting the documents for final assessment and publishing them on the www.ceipconsultation.sa.gov.au website.

Iron Road to Raise over \$9m to Progress the CEIP

On 16th June Iron Road announced an entitlement offer and institutional placement to raise capital to further progress the CEIP. Both the entitlement offer and placement (subject to shareholder approval) is expected to raise \$9.23 million before costs. This will place the company in a debt free position as it moves toward a final investment decision with project partner - China Railway Group Limited.
