Update on the CEIP MLP and EIS

Iron Road is continuing to work on the Response Documents for the MLP and EIS respectively with the aim of submitting them in June 2016 to enable final assessment of the proposals by the Department of State Development and Department of Planning, Transport and Infrastructure respectively.

The main challenges or areas of concern raised in the public submissions received during the consultation process were consistent with those raised during the Company's extensive community and stakeholder engagement and include:

- Air quality and potential impacts on crops, stock and human health;
- Water/Groundwater
- Integrated Waste Landform
- Loss of agricultural land/impacts on adjacent land
- Noise and vibration
- Social impacts (housing, workforce, infrastructure, safety and security)
- Traffic/Local road network
- Economic (viability, manufacturing, local procurement, employment)
- Mine closure
