About Iron Road


Iron Road (IRD) is the 100% owner of the Central Eyre Iron Project (CEIP), an advanced, long-life iron ore mining, beneficiation and infrastructure development opportunity on the Eyre Peninsula, South Australia. The CEIP comprises Australia's largest magnetite Ore Reserve of 3.7Bt (589Mt @ ~67% Fe concentrate) and proposes an open pit mine near Wudinna, a 130km infrastructure corridor and a deep-water port at Cape Hardy on the east coast of the Eyre Peninsula.

High quality CEIP iron concentrate product has demonstrated it can assist steelmakers lift productivity and better manage tightening environmental standards. These trends are expected to accelerate as the global steel industry seeks to progressively decarbonise. The planned export facility at Cape Hardy is designed to be South Australia's first Capesize capable port centred within an industrial precinct that will service multi-commodity exports and manufacturing capability.

Credible green iron manufacturing opportunities at the Cape Hardy Industrial Port Precinct are enabled due to the site's proximity to the world class CEIP magnetite orebody, large scale renewable energy resources, plans for industrial scale desalination (Northern Water) and multi-gigawatt green hydrogen / ammonia production (Amp Energy).

Iron Road continues to demonstrate its commitment to South Australia having invested approximately \$180 million to date in advancing the company's asset base.
